
Seasonal Kontakion in the Second Mode

The reading is from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 4:9-16.



Did You Know?

Did you know that Mount Athos is known as the Garden of the Panagia? One tradition tells us that the Theotokos was once sailing with St. John the Theologian to visit Lazarus in Cyprus, when a storm brought their ship to the shores of Mount Athos. As soon as she stepped onto the land, she was moved by its beauty and stillness — the sea, the forests, the cliffs. She prayed to her Son and asked Him to give this land to her. Christ answered her with love: "Let this be your garden, your inheritance, a place of peace for those who seek salvation." Since then, Mount Athos has belonged to her. The thousands of monks who have lived there over the centuries often speak of her not just as a distant figure, but as someone close, someone present. They will tell you she walks among them, watches over the monasteries, and comforts their hearts in silence. That's why no women go there — not because women are unwelcome, but because the Panagia is the only woman who reigns there, lovingly and fully. Every Athonite monastery is blessed with one or more wonderworking icons of the Theotokos. In all these ways, the Garden of the Panagia has truly become a place of prayer, repentance, stillness — and a quiet, radiant love that speaks without words.
