Intercede with Christ our God, for the salvation of our souls.

Memorial Hymn

Remember, O Lord, as You are good, Your servants, and forgive every sin they have committed in this life. For no one is sinless except You, Who have power to grant rest to those who have fallen asleep.

Apolytikion of the Church in the Fourth Mode

You ascended in glory, O Christ our God, after You filled the Disciples with joy, by promising to send them the Holy Spirit, and You blessed them and established their faith, that You are the Son of God, the Redeemer of the world.

Seasonal Kontakion in the Second Mode

O Protection of Christians that never falls, intercession with the Creator that never fails, we sinners beg you, do not ignore the voices of our prayers. O good Lady, we implore you, quickly come unto our aid, when we cry out to you with faith. Hurry to intercession, and hasten to supplication, O Theotokos who protect now and ever those who honor you.

The reading is from St. Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians 6:1-10.

Brethren, working together with Him, we entreat you not to accept the grace of God in vain. For He says, "At the acceptable time I have listened to you, and helped you on the day of salvation." Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. We put no obstacle in any one's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, tumults, labors, watching, hunger; by purity, knowledge, forbearance, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold we live; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

The Gospel of Luke 5:1-11



At that time, as Jesus was standing by the lake of Gennesaret, He saw two boats by the lake; but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, He asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the people from the boat. Did You Know?

Which translation of the Bible should I read? There are many different translations of the Holy Bible into English, which can make reading the Holy Scriptures—an essential exercise in our spiritual lives, which we all must undertake in our own time—into a daunting task. The best approach would be with the Orthodox Study Bible (OSB), a publication that includes helpful footnotes, maps, icons, and informational pages that help with reading the Bible in the Orthodox tradition. Can't find a copy? The New Testament in the OSB is actually the New King James Version (NKJV), which is widely available on its own. Other comparable translations are the older KJV and the more readable RSV, which we use during church services. Beyond these versions, there is a danger in reading translations of translations that lose the meaning of the original text, or otherwise reading translations that alter the text and introduce heresy. Whenever possible, it is best to read the original Greek text, which remains unchanged from its composition by the apostles in the first century A.D.
